The Coronation, even with all the pomp and pageantry, primarily a religious service, in which our King dedicates himself to his responsibilities as monarch. The most solemn moment of the service is not the placing of the crown on the King's head, but the anointing with holy oil, as a mark of the spiritual strengthening the monarch needs to fulfil his office both as King and as Supreme Governor of the Church of England.

On Coronation Day, our village will join with the whole country in celebration of the start of the new reign, and we will hopefully recall that, even in troubled and fractious times, we can come together as one nation to celebrate and enjoy our national identity.

It will be right, at that moment, to reflect on, and perhaps offer up, the prayer for the sovereign which is said at the beginning of the Book of Common Prayer service of Holy Communion. This prayer has been said for each monarch since at least the 1660s, and the Church will continue to pray it for King Charles and his successors

ALMIGHTY God, whose kingdom is ever-lasting, and power infinite: Have mercy upon the whole Church; and so rule the heart of thy chosen servant CHARLES, our King and Governor, that he (knowing whose minister he is) may above all things seek thy honour and glory: and that we and all his subjects (duly considering whose authority he hath) may faithfully serve, honour, and humbly obey him, in thee, and for thee, according to thy blessed Word and ordinance; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who with thee and the Holy Ghost liveth and reigneth, ever one God, world without end. **Amen**.

My First Coronation

I was eight in 1953 when our late Oueen was crowned, the children of St. Jude's School in Southsea each received a book commemorating the Coronation called Elizabeth Our Queen which was written by Richard Dimbleby with a preface by the then Lord Mayor of Portsmouth Frank Miles.

This is what he says to us children and I quote:

Oueen Elizabeth and her father and grandfather have set outstanding examples of service to their people and conscientious attention to duty.

Let us follow their example and dedicate ourselves to the service of our country, resolving to do our duty in whatever situation we may find ourselves; to consider more what we can give for the welfare of others, than we can get for the benefit of ourselves; and to make every effort to promote the well-being of our country,

our Commonwealth and all mankind. It is my earnest hope that in future years, when you have grown to manhood and womanhood, you may be able to look at this book and say that the 2nd June 1953, marked the beginning of a new era more fruitful of good than any which has gone before, and that our endeavours had helped to make it so.

The language of yesteryear, more like a rallying of the troops.

I was able to watch the Coronation on a neighbour's tv set specially bought for the occasion. It was the only one in the street and we all jammed into their sitting room on the big day to watch a very grainy grey and white picture. Although it was June, the weather was awful when the Queen set off in pouring rain which didn't help the tv coverage. As a treat, the school went to the cinema to watch the Coronation in glorious colour on the big screen and it was wonderful, our young Queen looking radiant. I don't remember a street party but I do remember the headmaster coming into our class room in 1952 to announce the King is Dead, some of us cried.

Luckily we have lived long enough to enter a new era under Charles III, I think he will be our Conservationist King, it is very pleasing that children today are seriously endeavouring to understand that the planet needs to be safeguarded and protected for the

future. I shall be glued, with my family, to the television to witness another piece of history being made in my lifetime and we will all enjoy every splendid moment.

Mountbatten's flagship fundraiser, thought to be the largest walking event of its kind in Europe, takes place on Sunday, 14 May. Each year, Walk the Wight raises hundreds of thousands of pounds to help Mountbatten deliver expert care and support to Islanders when they need it most.

Sponsored by Red Funnel, Walk the Wight is an epic walk across the beautiful Isle of Wight countryside and offers multiple route options to suit all ages and abilities.

For 26.5 miles of glorious Isle of Wight scenery, there is the Full Walk, between Bembridge and The Needles. For something more manageable, there are two Half Walks (12.5 or 14 miles), or the wheelchair accessible, pushchair friendly Flat Walk (eight miles), between Sandown and Shide.



Registration for the Island's largest and most iconic fundraising event, Walk the Wight, is still open!

Phase 2 of registration has now moved to Walker Number only. From this point, registration will cost £15 per person and walkers will collect their walker numbers at their chosen start line rather than receive a full walker pack in the post. Walker Number Only registration will close at 9am on Friday, May 12. After this time, walkers will only be able to register at the start lines (Bembridge, Carisbrooke or Sandown) on the day for a minimum donation of £20 per person.


Food for Thought - by Carole Barfoot


Flicking through a Good Housekeeping Cookery Compendium circa 1952, I realised just how many dishes have disappeared from our cuisine. Up until the sixties my mother-in-law would roast a bullock's heart for Sunday lunch. Then there was the dreaded tripe and onions which I only had once and then of course there was rabbit and jugged hare. On my way to school I would pass a pork butchers shop all the men wearing striped aprons and boaters, on sale would be small intestines called chittlins which could be fried. Alongside them were pigs' trotters which were mainly gristle and I would think, indigestible. I was rather shocked to find out that tongue was really a tongue, today I quite enjoy a faggot but they are hard to find. I remember my aunt asking her neighbour what they were having for dinner and back came the reply "bulls lugs", I think these are now dried and given to dogs to chew.

Who can remember fried sweetbreads, pigeon pie and boiled mutton? Our next-door neighbour had a lovely white bunny in a cage. One day his skin was staked out to dry in the sun and the next time I saw him (the rabbit) he was a pair of mittens. Fish was always plentiful and cheap and often we would have herring roe on toast for Sunday tea, also soused herrings and a half pint of winkles, which one prized out of their shells with a hatpin.

I am laughing to myself as I write, I think I can hear my vegetarian grandchildren screaming in horror and disbelief.






