

The Bridge is now back from its short Summer break, and it's September already. Goodness - where did the first eight months of 2025 go when we weren't looking?

Just as the break was beginning, we heard the sad news, which you may already know, that Rector Sandra's husband, Father Roy Matthews, had died after a short illness. A number of us from Wootton Parish went to his funeral on the mainland, and had the privilege of learning more about his remarkable life and ministry. There is a memoir of Roy on Page 2. An article by Sandra herself, on Jesus' command that we love our enemies, is on Page 4. This In turn reminds us of St Paul's instruction that we should pray for those who lead us. Our leaders (irrespective of party politics) have the responsibility to govern in our name; equally, we have a God given responsibility to pray for them.

As you know, we are pleased to host a page of news from Wootton Bridge Parish Council in each issue of the magazine. This is just one example of the cooperation between organisations in the village that passes almost unnoticed because it occurs on a daily basis and in unremarkable yet important ways. This month, an additional page of the magazine is given over to a survey that the Parish Council is conducting, to help it establish spending priorities for the coming year. I know that we all can feel bombarded with surveys of one kind and another, but this one is concerned with things that are immediate and local, and therefore of interest to all of us. Please take the trouble to complete the survey and return it to the Parish Council Office when you are out and about in the village.

At this point, you may just be wondering what all of this has to do with the picture at the top of the page. At one level, the answer is "not a lot". But, considered more deeply, it's all about sharing. The Bridge, with its focus on community, is a reminder that we all have a share in this place, in the joys, sorrows and concerns that affect us all, and in the beauty exemplified in the picture. The Parish Council Survey is much more than a bureaucratic process. It is a practical expression of our community life, and I hope that we can all give it our full support.

Remembering Father Roy



Father Roy Mattews

n 30th June, just as the previous edition of The Bridge was published, our Rector Sandra's husband, the Revd. Canon Roy Matthews, or Father Roy as he signed himself, died after a short illness. Roy had only been among us in the Medina Plurality for 11 months, but his ministry here has left us with a legacy of joyous memories which will long endure.

A full biography of Roy's rich life would not fit in these pages. Suffice to say that he was an ordained Anglican minister for over 60 years, and that, wherever he served, and in his own family, he left a heritage of Christian faith and understanding and enriched the lives of those around him. His six and a half feet of bearded presence, more often than not with twinkling eyes and a broad

grin, made you a friend even at the moment of first meeting. As soon as he spoke, his powerful Welsh voice told of his pride in the country both of his birth and of most of his ministry. And with that voice he made it his priority in life to preach the good news of Jesus in a manner that made his sermons direct and unforgettable.

One of Roy's many achievements was the sequence of 700 or so daily talks that he published on YouTube during the COVID pandemic. Those talks, still accessible online, are a precious reminder of Roy's ability to express our Christian faith simply and directly. The key good news message is that God has a purpose for the whole of his creation, including us, but he wants us to choose for ourselves to be part of that purpose. We can and do turn away from that purpose, and therein lies the reality of all the evil in the world, yet God is always willing to welcome us back. But we ourselves have to take that step.

Underpinning this seemingly simple message was a great depth of learning, particularly about the Hebrew language and scriptures. This scholarship, and living for a while among orthodox Jews in Israel, gave Roy the ability to explain how the Jewish experience and understanding of God gives us Christians new insights into our own faith. The connections between faiths are not trivial. They remind us, as Roy reminded us, that the connections within humanity are far more important than its divisions.

Roy leaves us a legacy of faith, commitment and understanding that is out of all proportion to the short time he was here in Wootton. We shall miss him, and look forward to meeting him again. In the meantime, we know that there is little point in asking that he rest in peace. As Sandra puts it, he is already out and about in Heaven, and he's having a whale of a time.

The Upside Down Kingdom - Love Your Enemy



Over the past few weeks, many of us have been saddened by the images we have seen of the ongoing suffering in places of war and conflict like the Ukraine, the Sudan, and the Middle East.

We have seen the numbers of those made homeless, suffering starvation and dying, constantly rising.

Whilst many across our World have marched for Peace, I have been asked on several occasions, "You have lived in Israel - what's the solution?"

My reply is always the same — JESUS.

When Jesus lived in Israel 2,000 years ago, the land was occupied by the Roman army because Israel was part of the Roman Empire.

Jesus therefore lived His whole life in a country that was filled with violence, injustice, and oppression, with brutal reprisals if any dared speak or act for freedom.

Many of the Jews at that time, consequently thought that their Saviour/Messiah would come in with military might and forcibly overthrow Rome. But instead?

Jesus came with the radical message of "love your enemies".

This radical command to love your enemy was the opposite to what the people had expected. Jesus took the people's expectations and turned them literally upside down, because He said that people should "love their enemies, and do good to those who persecuted them".

The Jewish word for love (because let's remember Jesus spoke Hebrew), means far more than having an emotional feeling or connection to somebody; it means to literally ACT lovingly towards somebody.

Jesus isn't saying that we should FEEL love for our enemies or the people we disagree with, but rather, that we should DO love to them and SHOW love towards them.

So when I am asked "what is the solution to the wars, violence, injustice, and oppression of our world?" - I say JESUS, or more specifically, IMPLEMENT and live by the words of Jesus.

In other words? DO love to others and SHOW love to others, even when they are unkind, unfair, and unjust towards us. Because that shows how we are living the Upside Down Kingdom, that Jesus ushered in.

But for that to happen, some things may have to change within our lives and attitudes, and we will look at another of those next month.



I am writing this in the middle of August, the sun is still shining and the children are making the most of their summer holidays. Holiday makers are enjoying the Island, swimming in the sea and visiting the attractions.

For the first time in the 26 years I have been enjoying the IOW, I visited the circus at Whippingham. I went with a friend and we booked front row seats which meant we were practically in the show, we were so close to the performers.

We were in awe of the skill and competency of the performers in their balance, strength, trust of each other and precision in their delivery. There were breath holding moments and gasps from the audience when feats of expertise were executed. It made me consider the time taken to practise, the exercise to develop the muscle strength to achieve the tasks. I pondered on the mental

concentration needed to be prepared to push their bodies through contortions and techniques of varying dexterities in all the different acts.
