WILD BIRD AID

Spring and Summer are our busiest seasons at Wild Bird Aid, with very many of the casualties we deal with being orphaned and injured baby birds. Apart from pigeons and doves (who do not breed exclusively through the warmer months), the first species to arrive are usually blackbirds and robins. These are followed by other garden bird species such as tits, finches and warblers, martins and swifts, crows, rooks, jackdaws, as well as ducklings, moorhens, coots, gulls and other seabirds (to name but a few).

When you come across a baby bird, it is sometimes difficult to know whether it requires help or not. Many garden bird species' young leave the nest before they are able to fly properly, and spend a few days hopping around on the ground and hiding in undergrowth whilst their parents still tend and protect. In these circumstances there is no reason to intervene - this is the natural process, and the parents are very capable of protecting their young in these transitional few days. The only time when one should 'help' a healthy fledgling bird is when it is out in the open, with no attention from its parents for a considerable length of time. If you are worried about cats or other predators, the fledgling can be placed in a box or bucket and



suspended (such as from a washing line) for the parent to tend to. If the fledgling is clearly injured, then it will need help regardless of whether the parents are in attendance or not, and should be placed in a box in a warm, quiet spot until it can be transferred to Wild Bird Aid (or other rescue), where the injuries can be assessed and treated.

A baby bird who cannot hop or run away from you when you approach it has either fallen, or been pushed from the nest. Sometimes they can be virtually fully feathered, but often they are much younger and are partially feathered or even naked. These birds will need help whether they are injured or not, as they are unable to run away from predators - and even if the parents continue to tend to them (which they often don't, as they know this baby is not going to survive) - intervention is needed to save it. In a few situations like this it is possible to replace the baby in its nest, but the best course would be to call Wild Bird Aid (or other rescue) for advice. Very often the nest is not accessible, or the baby is injured and needs to be treated and hand reared.

THE LOST MEMORIAL

The little cemetery at Wootton Common is now a place of peace and beauty thriving with wild flowers. By the time you read this orchids may well be in bloom. The church and school room built on this site are long gone and the cemetery itself is no longer used for burials.

There are various stories associated with the cemetery. Several years ago I received an enquiry from a family on the mainland who were looking into their family background. I was able to give them some pointers and in the end their enquiries were very successful. One of the family is buried here.

His name was John Willie Mcdine. He was born in Newport and joined the Black Watch, his father's regiment, at the age of 14. After a long a meritorious service, during which he won a number of medals including the DCM, he retired and spent 12 years as Landlord of the Woodmans Arms. At the outbreak of the Great War he joined up again but was invalided out. Sadly his son, James William, was killed in France in 1915, while serving with the Royal Highlanders

John Willie died in 1920 aged 54 and was buried in the cemetery after a military funeral. The news report in the *County Press* describes it in detail. Seventy Irish Rifles from Parkhurst Barracks escorted the coffin to St Mark's Church where Revd Causton conducted the funeral. The coffin was draped with the Union Jack on which were displayed his gallantry medals, with his Glengarry and red hackle (cap and a plume of feathers). Eight Warrant Officers acted as bearers and the band of the Royal Irish Rifles played funeral music and the hymn *Abide with Me* at the close of service. Family, local colleagues and former comrades attended the funeral. Although we know John Willie was interred at Wootton Common, sadly and surprisingly there is no memorial to identify the grave. Perhaps someone knows where it is. *D.M.G.*

Wrinkles, Anyone?

You know how no-one really wants to look like a wrinkled prune. Most women - and men - will try to stave off skin-ageing for as long as possible!

Now would it be OK if I ask you about your skincare? Do you prefer to spend that bit more on skincare which promises to "fight the x number of signs of ageing" and give you eternal youth, or do you grab whatever cheap cleanser or cream is on special offer at the supermarket?

I've tried both over the years: more expensive cream which felt smooth like plastic on my skin and the cheap stuff grabbed off the shelf in a hurry. Until I started to look more closely at the ingredients in all of these products. You know that your skin is the largest organ in (or on!) your body, and it absorbs a surprising amount of whatever we put on it. That includes shower gels, facial cleansers, aftershave balms, face creams and lipbalms, not to mention foundation and lipstick!

Many skincare products such as ones by companies and brands as diverse as BodyShop, Avon, E45, Vaseline, Boots, Nivea, Simple, Dove, Olay, L'Oreal, Garnier, Estee Lauder, Lancome, La Roche, Vichy, Clarins, Clinique, and Elemis often contain petroleum (petrolatum) and its by-products, which include liquid paraffin, sodium lauryl sulphate (SLS) and mineral oil. How lovely! Now I don't know about you but the thought of slapping petrol on my skin really doesn't appeal!

When was the last time you checked the ingredients list on the skincare products you have in your bathroom? Take a look now and see if you can also identify any of these other commonly-used ingredients:

- propylene glycol (hexylene glycol, butylene glycol) is an industrial solvent used in anti-freeze and paints
- PEG compounds are also used in oven cleaners
- paraben preservatives are hormone-disrupting chemicals which have been linked to breast cancers
- synthetic musk is also a common endocrine-disrupting chemical, often simply listed as 'parfum' or 'fragrance' (also in cosmetics, laundry detergents and fabric softeners)
- dimethicone is a widely used cheap polymer which creates a plastic-like barrier on the skin, preventing the skin from breathing. Prolonged use of dimethicone can induce dryness - and therefore the dreaded wrinkles! - and also lead to contact dermatitis
- methylisothiazolinone (MI) is another preservative, now often used in place of parabens; MI has been shown to cause allergic reactions.

So many of the skincare products available in the supermarkets and on the High Street contain one or more of these substances! Everyone uses some kind of soap, deodorant, cream, toothpaste, etc. every morning. Long-term exposure to this daily 'chemical soup' is causing increasing concern amongst cancer and skin specialists.

How do you find safer products to use, when you want to avoid the chemicals listed above? Well, I suggest you take a look at Faith In Nature products. Minister's Message

I again would like to use this month's ministers message to highlight what is believed to be the final celebrations in May of the Polish war ship that saved East and West Cowes. The following is taken from the Isle of Wight Tourist Website: If you're in Cowes and East Cowes during the first week of May, you'll notice a plethora of Polish events, activities and exhibitions springing up around the town. And if you're not planning to be in the area, we highly recommend you change your plans and come to the 75th anniversary commemoration of a very special Polish warship.

Not only did the ORP BLYSKAWICA jump in to defend East and West Cowes during a bombing raid by the Luftwaffe in 1942, it was also built by a leading Cowes shipyard in 1935. And to mark the Island's continued gratitude for the actions of the Polish captain and crew, the Friends of the ORP BLYSKAWICA Society have organised a host of events in their honour.

The bombing of Cowes and East Cowes

The 4th and 5th May 1942 were dark days in the history of Cowes. During the night of 4 May, the German air force launched a sustained and ferocious attack on the town with 160 bombers. These bombers could have easily decimated the area and killed hundreds, but the Polish Destroyer ORP BLYSKAWICA was in port - and she was armed. Around 70 people died during those raids, but thanks to the heroic actions of the crew of the ORP BLYSKAWICA and the Polish Navy, West and East Cowes was saved.

Why was a Polish warship in Cowes?

After the First World War, Poland wanted to boost their maritime fleet, and commissioned two ships from JS White in Cowes. ORP BLYSKAWICA ('lightning') was built along with ORP GROM ('thunder'). These state-of-the-art destroyers smashed their targets during the first sea trials in our very own Solent. Their progressive construction using riveted galvanised steel plates meant the hulls were flexible and able to go at speed. Launched from Cowes in 1935, the ships were destined to have a short-lived career as purely Polish vessels. In August 1939, they made the journey from their home port in Gdynia back to Cowes to become under the command of the British Navy.

Finally the following is an alternative version of 23rd Psalm known as the Sailorman's Prayer which will be read out during the remembrance at Kingston Cemetery:

The Lord is my pilot, I shall not drift
He lighteth me across the dark waters
He steereth me through the deep channels
He keepeth my log.

He guideth me by the Star of Holiness, for His name's sake.
Yea, though I sail mid the thunder and tempests of life
I shall fear no danger, for thou art near me.
Thy love and thy care shelter me
Thou prepares a harbour before me in the Homeland of Eternity.
Thou anointest the waters with oil, my ship rideth calmly.
Surely sunlight and starlight shall favour me
on the voyage I take and I will rest
In the port of my God forever. Amen

Standing with refugees like Nejebbar

Nejebbar has fled terrible conflict in Afghanistan. She's now living in a refugee camp in Greece. Nejebbar and her family have

fled horrors in Afghanistan, where her husband was threatened with torture and death for being a government worker.

But now they've arrived in Greece, all they have is a tent. They have no other protection against wind and rain. There's no school for their five children. And they have no certainty or clear idea of what will happen to them now. They thought they would stay here for 10 days, but it's already been six months and there's no end in sight.

Nejebbar's husband Noor describes their initial reaction to arriving in the camp in Greece: "It was like suicide for us. But we took the decision that it is better to die here than to die there from war."



SCAM UPDATE

Some types of Internet scam pop up again from time to time, though they are mostly sorted into a special Spam Folder on my hard drive. Occasionally quite innocent messages do end up there too so I generally check, anyway.

An old one I still sometimes see is where a stranger offers you a fortune. Here, "If it seems too good to be true it probably is" is useful to remember. A newer one I have encountered is where you may receive a phone call from persons unknown. It may sound like a call centre- you can hear the sounds in the background. The caller may say repeatedly "Can you hear me?" It sounds innocuous but what is said to be happening is that the caller wants to trick you into answering "Yes" and perhaps to say other key words, which they will record, and use to perpetrate fraud. Even if this is not a scam per se it pays to be wary of unknown persons ringing you out of the blue, especially if the number is unobtainable.

Don't forget if you can obtain the caller's phone number you can access the Internet to check the number on whocalled.co.uk A number of suspicious numbers have appeared in the Call List of my mobile phone which turned out to be premium rate numbers. If you were to call back it would cost!!



Building Bridges in the Community

So, what's in a name?

The copy date for *The Bridge* this month is a bit earlier than normal, and comes at a point when a spell of mostly fine weather has made our early Spring even more bright and colourful than usual. It seemed only right to arm myself with camera and long lens, venture out on to the green at the end of Sloop Lane, and record the scene. The picture on this page serves no other purpose than to remind us that we are fortunate enough to live in a rather special place.

Meanwhile, one small item in the news piqued my interest, as a spat developed between various dignitaries of the Church and organisations they accused of ignoring, down-playing or devaluing the real meaning of Easter. You will have your own views as to whether this claim was justified, and whether the whole argument was a storm in a teacup. There is also, no doubt, an element of irony in the fact that the very name 'Easter' is quite probably of pagan origin. That does not, of course, stop the Church from emphasising (with some justification) the importance of Easter as part of the traditions and culture of our society, while holding onto ownership of the name of the most important of its festivals.

Names are powerful and symbolic. We know that, because we live in a village with two names. When I first came here half a century ago, those who lived nearer the top of the High Street generally said they

lived in 'Wootton', while those who lived at the bottom of the hill lived in 'Wootton Bridge'. 'Wootton' was, in former times, centred on the Manor, of which St Edmund's church is the only surviving building. 'Wootton Bridge' was a cluster of buildings around the tide mill at the end of the bridge, in the ownership and control of the old Quarr Abbey. And this distinction between what people clearly felt were two separate places continued from the Middle Ages well into the twentieth century.

Nowadays, we seem to refer interchangeably to 'Wootton' and 'Wootton Bridge'. The Church, harking back to its former connection with the Manor, is 'The Parish of Wootton', while the civil Parish Council has understandably chosen to use the more distinctive 'Wootton Bridge'. But we both know that we are referring to the same place, and we both seek to serve the same community.

This subtle, and almost unconscious, shift in the way we name the place where we live has brought us both gain and loss. We have lost the clearly defined identities of the distinct (and tiny) communities that still existed a century ago. But as those communities grew and merged to become the much larger township we now are, we gained a single identity in which both of the old names have a place. To my mind, the gain outweighs the loss. *David Bennison*
